Congress Resumes Work; Concludes Productive First Week

Congress Passes Bill to Fund the Government, Raise Debt Limit, and Provide Relief Funding for Hurricane Harvey

On Friday, Congress passed a combined package of legislation which includes a Continuing Resolution (CR) to fund the federal government and suspend the national debt ceiling, both through December 8, 2017. Federal government funding had been scheduled to expire at the end of September. The legislation also provides aid for Hurricane Harvey relief, including \$15.25 billion for disaster recovery programs. The bill passed the Senate by a vote of 80 - 17 on Thursday afternoon and was approved by the House of Representatives by a vote of 316 - 90 this morning. President Trump is expected to sign the legislation.

Work Continues on Minibus Appropriations Bill

Also this week, the House continued progress on H.R. 3354, the Make America Secure and Prosperous Appropriations Act, 2018, which includes appropriations for the U.S. Department of Transportation for FY 2018. The bill would fully fund all Mass Transit Account programs at the \$9.733 billion level authorized in the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act. The bill, however, only would fund the Capital Investment Grant (CIG) program at \$1.753 billion, which is \$549 million below the FAST Act authorized level. Additionally, the bill would zero out the TIGER Grant program. Work on this legislation is expected to continue once the House reconvenes next week. With the passage of CR through December 8, Congress has until that time to conclude the FY 18 appropriations process.

Williams Appointed Deputy Administrator of Federal Transit Administration (FTA)

FTA has announced the appointment of K. Jane Williams as deputy administrator. Williams previously was director of the Washington area transit office at Maryland DOT, where she worked closely with the leadership of the Maryland Transit Administration and Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA). She has served at the Departments of Energy and Labor under President Reagan and the Department of Interior under President George H.W. Bush and was a senior legislative advisor to Rep. Andy Harris (R-MD).
